The Annual Report of The Standard Bank of Canada

The thirty-first annual meeting of the shareholders of the Standard Bank of Canada was held at the corner of Jordan and Wellington Streets, Toronto, on the 20th inst. Among those present were: W. F. Allen, R. C. Bickerton, W. E. Cowan, Fred. W. Cowan, W. Francis, J. Hodley, W. H. Johnston, David Kidd (Hamilton), H. Langlois, J. K. Niven, G. B. Smith, W. W. Tumbly, Frederick Wylde, and others.

The chairman read the report of the directors, and the general manager read the statement of the affairs of the bank, as on the 31st May, 1906.

The directors beg to present to the shareholders, the thirty-first annual report for the year ending 31st May, 1906, together with the usual statement of assets and liabilities.

The business of the past year has been very satisfactory and the net profits, after making provision for bad and doubtful debts, for rebate of interest on unmatured bills under discount, etc., amount to \$175,532.03.

This has been added to the \$184,278, the premium on new stock issued at \$200 on the 15th May, 1906, which, together with the balance of profit and loss account of \$62,114.83 brought forward from last year, amounts to \$422,044.86.
