

On the other hand, the existing law which provides that a wife may ob

granted without any apparent reason, provided that both parties make formal legal request for divorce and persist in this request for a period of two years. In all such cases, however, two years must elapse before

The reformers go so far as to propose, that after his probationary period of two years a divorce may be granted without any specific reason parties, even should the other party be opposed to the decree.


