

CRIME IN FIGURES. Statistics For England and Wales For the Year 1904-Enormous Total of Persons Tried.

A bluebook was issued recently, says Joyd's Weekly, by the Home Office giving the criminal statistics of England and Wales for the year 1904. It shows that the total number of persons tried for various offences during the 12 months was 807,139, as compared with 802,696 in the previous 12 months, the convictions being 665,379 against 660,-300. The persons imprisoned numbered 199,153, as compared with 189,727 in value as criteria of the state of crime but they all indicate an increase of eriminalty.
