LIGHT IN BULL'S EYES.

Twelve Year Old Boy Saved Life of His Father.
Wilmington, Del., July 17.—Representative Timothy J. Townsend, among the ranking Republicans in the Delaware legislature, owes his life to the presence of mind of his twelve-year-old son Fred. It was learned yesterday when an infuriated bull attacked the legislator, that his large farm near Frankford was going to him severely, the young son seized a milk pail, and as the sun was shining brightly, threw its reflection into the bull's eyes. The animal came terror-stricken and fled from the enclosure. Mr. Townsend is badly injured, but will recover.

Niagara Falls, Ont., July 17.—A man named Bailey, wanted at Middletown, Conn., for the murder of a farmer named Goodell on July 6th, was arrested at the farm of Albert Disher in North Pelham about fifteen miles west of here early this morning. The arrest was made by Chief of Police Main, Ontario Officer Fay, of this city and Detective Thomson, of Middletown. Bailey, when arrested, had hired out as farm hand with Disher and strongly denied his guilt. After being brought here, he consented to return to Middletown without extradition proceedings.
