GO BACK TO JAIL

ITALIANS ARE NOT PLEASED WITH VACATION.

Maybe Some of Them Will Come Up For Trial Next Week—Barrister's Case Did Not Proceed.

Mayor Mowat was on the bench at the police court, this morning, when the twelve Italians, who were once more before him, were once more before him. The procession from the jail to the hall of justice and return has become a feature of weekly interest and has ceased to attract the crowds of former occasions. This morning, when the dozen filed into court they bore a marked contrast to their appearance when first on the dock for short spinnak of a jet black and curly variety adorned their chins and upper lips with but one youthful exception. There was nothing doing. The prisoners were remanded by the mayor, who had no other course to pursue, though he felt very rather, as he has, for those who claimed to be innocent. Communication will be entered into with the G.T.R. authorities, at Montreal, and it is likely that when the foreigners again appear, next week, at least one of their number will be dealt with.

The second case to be called was one against Com. Millan. The man, Patterson, who laid the information against the hotelkeepers, is now in the White Caps debt summary justice. He claimed an assault had been committed and named the defendant he could recognize. T. J. Rigney appeared for Millan. After waiting a quarter of an hour for Patterson to appear, the mayor dismissed the case, with a few remarks to the effect that the law was most emphatic regarding such cases. No matter what crime had been committed, there was always redress to be had, and no citizen should take the law in his own hands. In this case Patterson had apparently concluded that he had made a mistake regarding Millan's identity and decided to drop the case. The court then adjourned and as those in attendance filed out, they met the plaintiff hastening towards the entrance.

At a council meeting in Benbow the resignation of Chief Constable McErmott was under consideration. A petition was largely signed by the townspeople to retain him, which, after not a little hot discussion, was carried by a narrow majority, to offer him a larger salary, but no lessening of duties. There was a persistent rumor about the streets this morning to the effect that the steamer Iroquois had stopped calling at Kingston on account of the rigid enforcement of the customs law which refused to allow clearance if she made this city a sign-day port of call. Enquiry at the wharf office confirmed it as a measure, the steamer Iroquois would only come to Kingston when there were passengers to be landed here. That accounts for her regular call at the wharf this morning. In as far as the traffic out of Kingston is concerned this virtual ban is the same as if the city were not a port of call for no one can be sure any length of time beforehand whether the ban is due to call or not. In the opinion of many marine men it is simply the first step towards cutting out Kingston altogether and returning to the old schedule and time-table.

Acting Reeve Kennedy has declared Monday as Portmouth's civic holiday, this making it the same date as that for Kingston.

Looking For An Italian. This morning the police authorities received a circular containing a description of Antonio Laperna, an Italian, aged twenty-five years, five feet five inches in height, and weighing 150 pounds. A photographic reproduction of his likeness accompanies the letter. Laperna is a quarryman by trade and on January 21st shot a countryman named Carlo Ronzanza, who died from the effects of his wounds. The culprit made good his escape and efforts are now being made to apprehend him. He is known to have associated with the lower class of Italians and among these and railroad construction or mining he is most likely to be found. The circular was over the signature of C. G. Gillispie, acting chief of police of St. Louis, U.S.

AN IMMENSE CROWD AT MACDONALD PARK BAND CONCERT.

An immense crowd was in Macdonald Park, last evening, for the second concert of the week by the 14th Regimental band. It was a beautiful evening on land and water, and the shore front of the park was dotted with skiffs, canoes, dinghies, and launches. While the new moon shed some light upon the scene, the electric arc lamps placed in a circle around the high flag pole, at a distance of twenty-five feet from the ground, were in operation and lighted the main portion of the park quite satisfactorily, though if they were placed twice as high, there would be better results. Several police constables were in the park and there was much better order on the part of the riotous small boy, who is generally a nuisance on band concert occasions. Most people do not go to hear the music, and should not be deprived of the pleasure through the wild pranks of unruly youths.
