Bell Company Begins Work at Cape Vincent.

Watertown, N.Y., Standard, The Central New York Telephone and Telegraph company began on Tuesday placing a cable from Cape Vincent to Wolfe Island. The cable is one of the largest that the compan has ever handled, and is about a mil in length, weighing eighteen tons. The cable contains ten pairs of wires, and is two inches in diameter by about six inches in circumference. It was made by the Western Electric company New York, and Robert W. Gillespie, is at the Cape superintending the laying


