COMMERCIAL MATTERS.

What is Going On in the Business World—The Markets.

The O.P.R.'s rate is not profits for the fiscal year ending June 30th, total \$7,498,224.

A merger of the Great, California, Novaty, Casey, Garraide and other properties west of the St. Louis, is rumored.

About \$25,000 has been recently spent in improving the old machinery and the purchase of new machinery for the copper mine at Elendano.

The Central Ontario railway has a contract to carry 50,000 tons of iron ore from the West to the mines, for transmission to the St. Lawrence.

The Detroit United is negotiating for the purchase of the Windsor and small traction on the Canadian side of the Detroit river.

It has been estimated that the farm stock of the United Kingdom—cattle, sheep, and pigs—only has a value of \$74,200,000, and that from this the butcher annually receives fat animals to the value of \$79,000,000.

The directors of the New Brunswick Portland Cement Co. have decided to apply to the government to increase the duty on cement from \$550,000 to \$1,000,000. For some years the company has been paying a dividend of 8 per cent.

The Hunt Brothers, Limited, of London, Ontario, capitalists, has incorporated to carry on a flour and grain business, with a capital of \$1,000,000, and the chief place of business will be London, Ont.

Work was commenced on Monday upon the new warehouse to be erected by the Peterborough Shovel and Tool company. The building will be 40 ft. by 130 ft., and will be built beside the C.P.R. siding in the company's property.
