IS FORGING AHEAD

FORT WILLIAM WILL BE A GREAT METROPOLIS.
Says a Resident of Western City--Town is Fast Gaining Ground as Chief Wheat Distributing Centre For the Great Lakes.

Montreal, Aug. 3.--"Fort William is more prosperous and growing faster than any other city or town in the middle of Canada, and it is only a matter of a very short time before it becomes the real metropolis of the district between the head of the lakes and the Rockies," said A. A. Vickers, a leading business man of Fort William. Moreover, Mr. Vickers was able to back up his optimism with facts and figures that would make any staid eastern town sit up and take notice.

"You see," said Mr. Vickers, who is a brother of V. G. R. Vickers, superintendent of the Dominion Express Company, "Fort William is fast becoming the chief distributing centre of the great lakes, and its port is yearly visited by increasing numbers of ships. I do not suppose that there was a day this season but that there have been upwards of fifteen boats in the harbor. During the past year we have shipped out thirty million bushels of wheat, and the traffic is growing daily.

"As a result of this, it has become necessary to increase our harbor facilities, and the government is spending \$4,000,000 widening the Kaministiquia river to six hundred feet, so that boats in the harbor can turn around without going up stream."

DYNAMITE PENCIL HOLDERS.

Children in School Found to Be Using Dangerous Detonators.
