READY TO FIGHT

THE JEWS URGED TO ANSWER CALL BY SIGNAL

Train Robbers Steal \$40,000 of Government Money and Several Passengers Are Wounded—Thousands Are on Strike.

Warsaw, Russian Poland, Aug. 6.—A telegram from Libau says that train robbers, between Libau and Kacivort, stole \$40,000 of government money.

Eight passengers were wounded in defence of the train, among them being the consul-general of Brazil and a German named Gerhardt.

A plan to liberate the political prisoners here was betrayed to the authorities, to-day. Several civil servants and policemen who were implicated have been arrested.

Jews Urge Fight

Warsaw, Russian Poland, Aug. 6.—The Jewish socialists in a proclamation urge the Jews to stand up to fight, and should the signal be given, they are requested to appear in the streets armed.

Burned Alive

Berlin, Aug. 6.—The devastation wrought by the drunken and ferocious peasants of the governments of Tarnobol and Varonje, during the past few days, has been appalling.

In one district of Varonje alone the losses inflicted by the peasants amount to more than \$5,000.

70,000 Are Out

St. Petersburg, Aug. 6.—The general strike has not been marked with the enthusiasm and snap that characterized the response to the call last week.

Over 70,000 men are out at St. Petersburg and the authorities are greatly concerned in consequence.

Dragoons and Cossacks are in evidence in the principal streets and police pickets, armed with rifles, are at almost every corner.

London, Aug. 6.—A despatch to the Evening Standard from Moscow says that a number of workmen here had prepared to receive with bombs a detachment of troops sent against them.
