A COUNTRY'S HONOR

AHEAD OF THE PUNISHING OF CRIMINALS.

So Says Judge Hough Hearing in Case of Brown, Extradited on One Charge and Sent to Prison on Another. New York, Aug. 8.—That the honor of the United States is of more importance than the punishment of a million criminals was the statement made by Judge Hough in the United States circuit court in the habeas corpus proceedings instituted in behalf of Charles C. Brown.

Special Assistant United States Attorney-General W. Wickham Smith, arguing against the writ, said that "extradition was not made for the benefit of criminals," and insisted that no violation of the treaty occurred.
