SYNOP IS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Douring Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of the extent of one-quarter secof 160 acres more or less. Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior. Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate receive authority for some one to

make entry for him. HOMESTEAD DUTIES: A settler who has been granted an entry for a home-stead is required to perform the con-ditions connected therewith under one of the following plans : (1) at least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land is each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining materit may residence prior to obtaining patent may

(3) If the settler has his permanent esidence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the APPLICATION FOR PATENT should be made at the end of three years, be-fore the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the

Before making applications for patent the sottler must give six month's notice in writing to the Commissioner of Do-minion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS.

Coal.—Coal lands may be purchased at \$10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual or com-nany. Royalty at the rate of ten cents per ton of 2,000 pounds shall be collected

The fee for recording a claim is \$5, At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may, upon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 an acre.

The patent provides for the payment of a royalty of 2; per cent on the sales.


