Bad As San Francisco. London, Aug. 18.—Prof. C. M. Milne, the seismologist, reports from the Isle of Wight that his records indicate an earthquake as great as that of San Francisco, lasting for five hours, apparently located along the coast considerably north of Valparaiso.

Fielding's Election Void. Halifax, Aug. 18.—Chief Justice Weatherbe and Judge Russell, comprising the court which tried the petition against the return of Hon. W. S. Fielding, minister of finance, as member of Queen's and Shelburne, at the election of November, 1904, gave decision, at Liverpool, dismissing the personal charges of corrupt acts against Mr. Fielding, but declaring the election void, the court holding that the agency of E. M. Farrell, Liverpool, had been established, and that the payment of \$500 by the latter to John Seldon, a week before the election, was an illegal act, although Seldon swore that the money was expended for legitimate campaign purposes.

Woman's Long Swim. London, Aug. 18.—The Thames swimming record was broken on Tuesday last by Miss Ethel Littlewood, a hospital nurse, twenty-three years old, who swam from Sunbury Lock to the Isleworth gate of Kew Gardens, a distance of sixteen miles, in eleven hours.

Convicted Of Bribery. Perryville, Ark., Aug. 18.—State Senator F. O. Butt was convicted by a jury in the circuit court, on a charge of offering a bribe to another state senator. He was sentenced to two years in the penitentiary and fined \$200.
