KILLED IN HIS BED. By a Locomotive Crashing Into His Shanty. Syracuse, N.Y., Aug. 24--A peculiar railroad accident occurred yesterday, resulting in the death of George Carberry, thirty years old, while asleep in his bed. A shifting engine on a New York Central siding bumped some cars against a building, the latter went over the bump, which was a tie crosswise on the tracks, and fell on a telegraph pole and flag shanty, and crashed into Carberry's house. The second story fell into the first pinning Carberry in his bed. Three families sleeping in the second story, were precipitated to the floor, but escaped serious injury.

Respect Worth \$1,000,000. Mahanoy City, Pa., Aug. 24--Because of the custom prevailing in the anthracite field to attend the funeral of all victims of mine fatalities the employees sacrificed about \$1,000,000 in wages last year when 614 lives were lost. Steps will be taken at the forthcoming annual convention next month of the United Mine Workers of America to abolish the custom and have the colliery at which a victim perishes work on his funeral day, and instead of the members paying tribute to his memory by taking a holiday, to devote fifty per cent. of the victim's earnings to the family of the victim.

Hissed The Lily. London, Aug. 24--Mrs. Langtry, who had two wins at the Folkestone races had an unpleasant experience in the evening. She had been advertised to give a dramatic performance in the pavilion at Folkestone. The audience was increased because the play she presented was only a trifling South African episode, lasting twenty minutes, and a hostile crowd followed Mrs. Langtry off the pier, vigorously hissing her. The actress was escorted to her hotel by policemen.

A "Purity Farm School." Guthrie, Okla., Aug. 24--Carrie Nation's business manager has purchased forty acres of ground in the eastern suburbs of the capital city of the new state, on which will be erected a purity farm school and home for poor boys. Mrs. Nation donated the \$5,000 to Rev. Charles Mitchell, of Missouri, who will be in charge of the institution.
