Any who intend to settle in the Northwest Territories, including the Yukon, must first be a Canadian citizen...

RESIDENTIAL DUTIES: A settler who has been granted a section of land is required to perform the conditions mentioned under one of the following plans:

1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) is a Canadian citizen...

3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon another section of land...

APPLICATION FOR PATENT should be made at the end of three years...
