REV. HERBERT GROUT

Preached in St. George's Cathedral, on Sunday.

Rev. G. H. P. Grout, Delhi, N.Y., preached in St. George's cathedral, Sunday morning, basing his remarks on the parable, viz., "Saved by Hope." He pointed to the supreme need of hope in the great apostrophe of life, since so much of his work was apparently fruitless, and many of its results so quickly overthrown.
