#### YANKEE WOMEN ARE SAID TO FREELY IMBIBE.

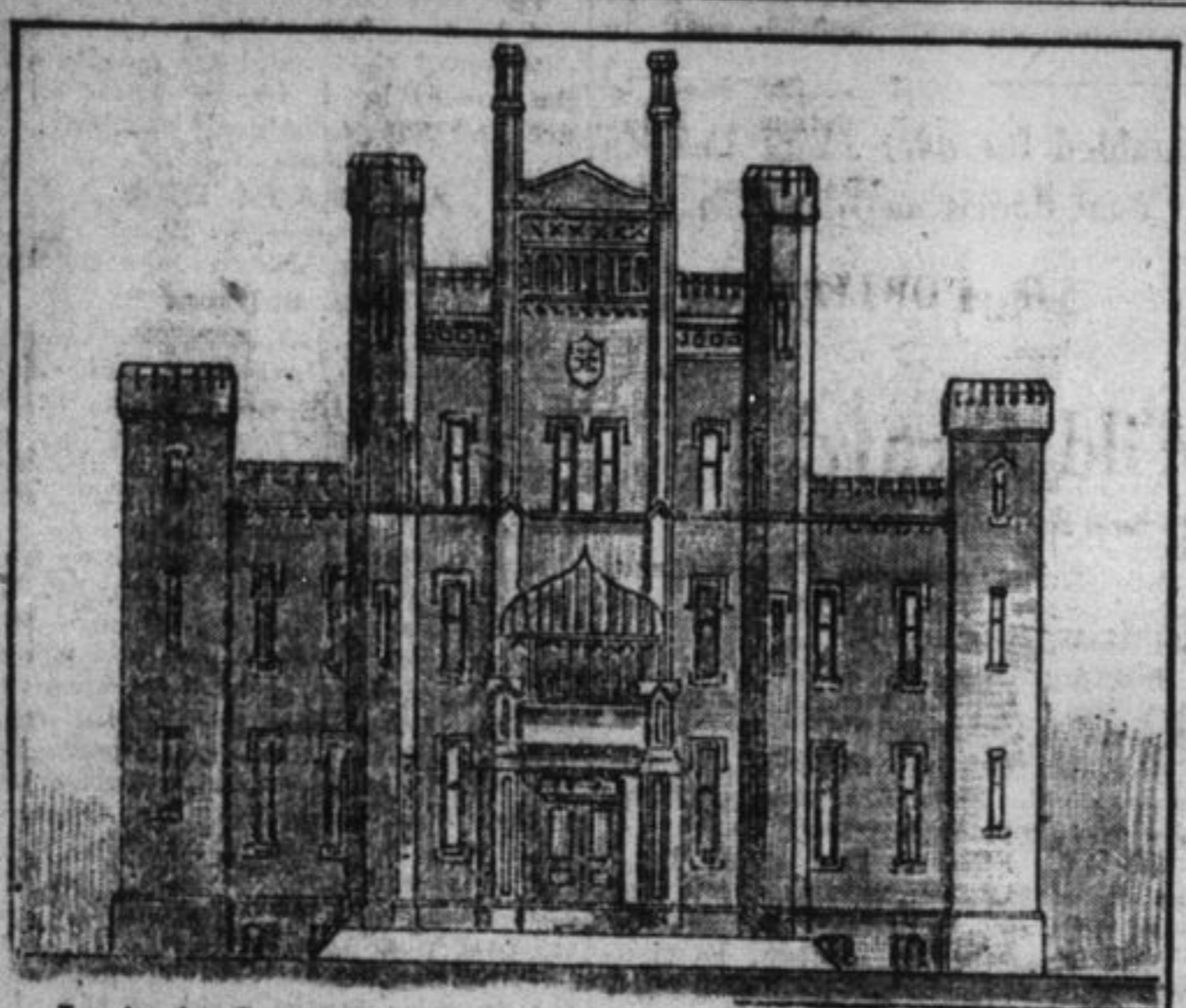
Nature's Future Darkened By Feminine Folly—Strong Indictment of American Woman By Baptist Minister.

Madison Peters, pastor of the Baptist Church of the Epiphany, New York, writes as follows:

## BISON FURNACE
