Where an entry is summarily cancelled or voluntarily abandoned, subsequent to estitution of cancellation proceedings the applicant for inspection will be en-An hearts for inspection must state in what particulars the homesteader is in default, and if subsequently the state-ment is found to be incorrect in materparticulars, the applicant will lose any prior right of re-entry should the land become vacant, or if entry has been granted it may be summarily cancelled. Duties .- A settler is required to per-form the conditions under one of the following plans :-

(1) At least six months' residence up year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such homesteader the requirement as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the

(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirement may be satisfied by residence upon such land. 


