INCREASED TRADE. BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES.

Consul Van Sant Reports to Washington - Some of the Reasons Given For the Close Relations Between the Two Countries.

United States Consul Van Sant, of Kingston, reports to the Bureau of Manufactures at Washington that the commercial relations of the United States with Canada are getting closer, and gives some interesting reasons.

His report states that while the loyalty of Canada to the empire is as strong as ever, the trade relations between the two border countries of this continent increase. The needs of the two peoples are similar, and only a few hours separates the commercial centres of each. The intercourse of necessity is more frequent. The retailer will explain that goods bought in the states are more quickly, cheaply and safely handled than those from Great Britain; and for this reason the Canadian imports from the U. S. are increasing.

In a recent report, Consul Van Sant pointed out the increased trade of the Kingston district with the United States, whose exports to this city are increasing each year.
