These were the last words of Zhenide Konopliankova, the girl who assassinated Gen. Mien, last month, and who was sentenced to death by a court martial.

JEWISH EXTIRPATION

Odessa, Sept. 13.—A proclamation has been posted throughout the city, issued by the "Union of Russian People," urging patriots to combine to exterminate the Jews. It is reported the Jewish town of Koonin has been burned by peasants and many lives lost.
