SOME FRESH IDEAS

AS TO RAILWAYS—HANDLING GRAIN AT ELEVATORS.

Should Only Be Trustees of Grain in Transit—The Inspection Act is Regarded as Quite Satisfactory.

Toronto, Sept. 25.—At this morning's session of the grain commission A. A. Wright, whose evidence was not concluded yesterday, said he thought the railway companies should be compelled to furnish cargoes to vessels promptly to pay demurrage as terminal elevators, where practically controlled by the railroads, that elevators should not be allowed to buy or sell grain but should be regarded as trustees of grain in transit; that elevators should be required to submit their books for government inspection; that grain should be weighed out of elevators on the same scales as weighed in.

William Snyder, Waterloo, promised the commission to extend a statement which he had prepared for shortages and averages on cars loaded from lake ports and other shipping points in Ontario.

J. L. Spink, Toronto, intimated that Manitoba wheat and flour were over-estimated and said that the chief virtue of Manitoba flour was its strength. He regarded the inspection act as satisfactory.

A CANADIAN MURDERED. Saskatchewan Man Believed to Have Been Killed.

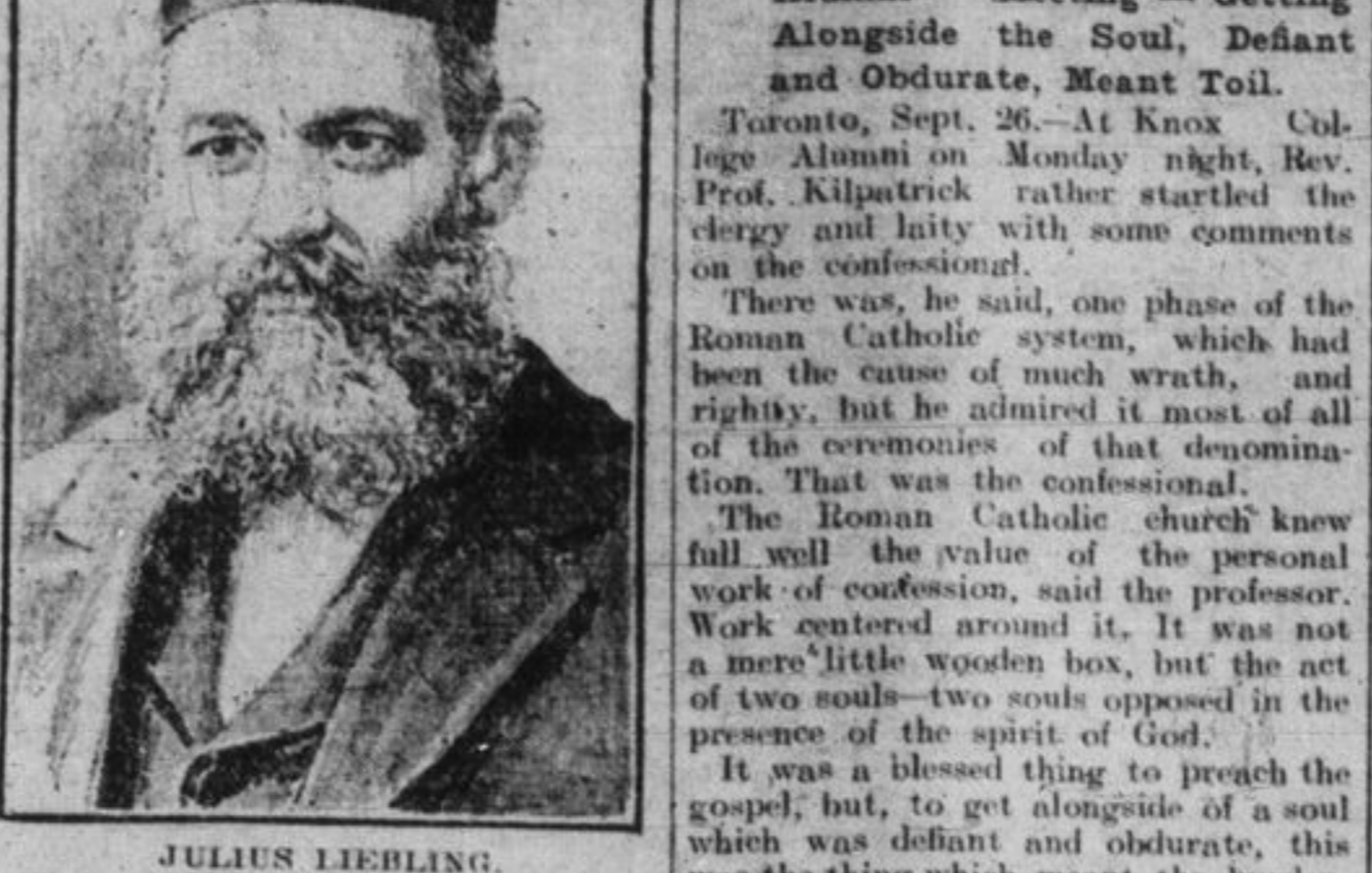
