CONTRACT AWARDED

FOR GAS HOLDER FOUNDATION EXCAVATION.

Alexander Tait Got the Contract For \$4,545—This Amount is \$455 Less Than J. M. Campbell's Estimate.

The civic light committee had a special meeting, yesterday afternoon, to open tenders for excavating and doing the masonry and concrete work for the new gas-holder foundation. In attendance were Alder Tove (chairman), Elliott, Gaskin and Kent.

When the matter was first before the committee, last month, J. M. Campbell estimated that the foundation work could be done for \$5,000. It was decided to call for tenders, and the result was that the lowest contract was \$6,765. Then the committee decided to do the work by day labor, and reject the tenders. Recently, it was given out that a couple of contractors would undertake the work within the \$5,000 estimate of Mr. Campbell, and the committee had a conference and decided to call for new tenders. These were later received at yesterday's meeting, and the lowest was \$455 less than Mr. Campbell's estimate.

Three tenders were received. W. H. Mitchell's was not given a bulk sum, but was far above the other two. R. Wallace's figure was \$4,550, and Alexander Tait's \$4,545. The latter, being the lowest, was accepted. A marked cheque for \$500 was required with each tender. Instead of the amount being retained, the successful tenderer is allowed to give satisfactory bonds to the extent of \$1,000. Mr. Tait is the city stone contractor, and ran hand the rock excavation to advantage.

TO CONSIDER REVENUES.

The Millers of Ontario at a Disadvantage.

Toronto, Sept. 25.—The grain commission, recently appointed by the Ontario government to investigate and report upon the grievances of millers and others in connection with grain matters in the province, began their sitting in the board of trade council chamber this morning. C. B. Miller, secretary of the Dominion Millers' Association, complained because sometimes carloads of wheat were put into a properly cleaned and bonded miller who had happened to buy the grain in the bottom of the mill received more dirt than his share. Mr. Watts objected to the proposed sample market, at Wainwright, as it would increase the troubles of Ontario millers through there being a scarcity of cars. Mixing grain in elevators was objected to, as No. 1 Northern wheat became mixed with poorer grades, which all went out as No. 1. If all elevators were licensed and bonded, Mr. Watts thought, the present grievances against them could be removed. A change in railway certificates of grain was suggested.
