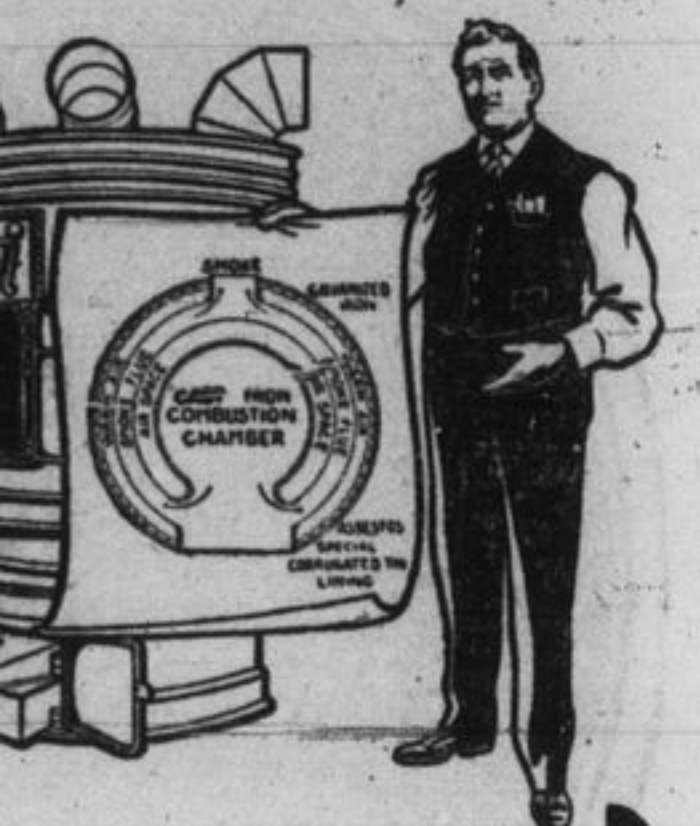

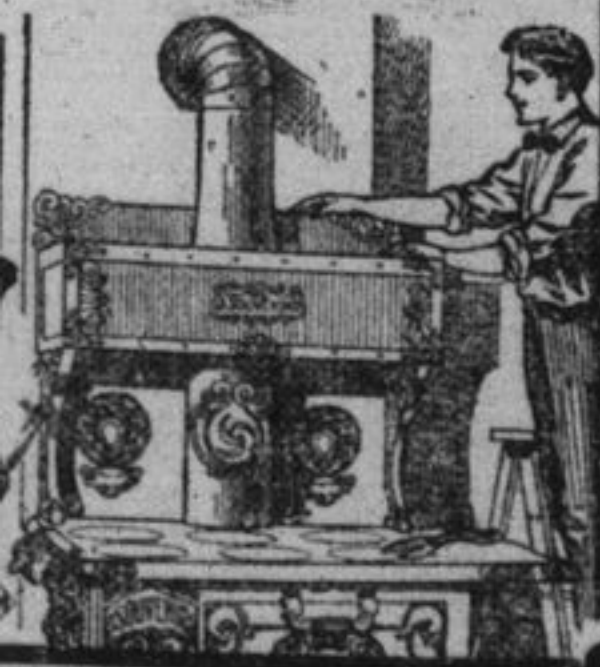

the sidewalks and for the first time in
the memory of the oldest inhabitants

A NOBLE ENEMY.
Fate of Mokran, Moslem Chief
of Africa.

France was never in greater danger
of losing her colonies in Africa than
during the war with Germany in Paris.
The troops were recalled from Africa
to take part in the conflict—that was
going on against France, and Algeria
was left almost defenceless.

The hour for which the conquered
races had long waited had come, and
if a holy war had been proclaimed it
is probable that the French would
have been driven from Northern Africa.

But the tribes did not rise while the
French had their hands full on the
other side of the Mediterranean, and
the fact was due to their fidelity to
a solemn pledge.

When the war broke out a chief of
great influence among the tribes, Mo-
krani, gave his word to the governor
generals of Algeria that there should
be no insurrection while the war lasted.
That word was faithfully kept.

Disaster after disaster followed the
French armistice. The defeats of the war
annihilated the surrender of Paris.
But not a man of the tribes of Kabylia
stirred. The Moslem's faith was kept.

When, however, the last battle had
been fought and the treaty of peace
signed, Mokran, then released from
his word, gave the governor general
notice that in forty-eight hours he
would declare war. The French
armistice, released from duty at home,
hurried across the Mediterranean. The
end was inevitable. Mokran, seeing
that all was lost, put himself at the
head of his warriors and fell fighting
in the front ranks. The French erected
a monument to mark the spot where
their noble enemy perished.

Long Lived English Lawyers.
Manchester Ideas.

Lawyers have long been famous for
their longevity. Seldom, however, has
the bar been able to number among
its practicing members a gentleman of
ninety-four summers. Arthur Burrows,
a well-known member of the Circle of
Conveyancers in Lincoln's Inn, com-
pleted his ninety-fourth year on Sun-
day. Yet the title of "Father of the
Bar," which has been bestowed upon
him, does not really belong to him.
The distinction of being the senior
member of the bar belongs to W. A.
G. Hake, who was called at the Mid-
dle Temple in 1835, and whose ad-
dress at Brighton is given in the law
list for the present year. Mr. Burrows
joined the bar at Lincoln's Inn eight-
teen months later. The distinction of
being the oldest lawyer in the country
belongs to a member of the other
branch of the legal profession, Mr.
Emmerson, who practices at Deal, be-
came a solicitor as long ago as 1833.
Lord Field, who celebrated his ninety-
third birthday on August 21st, prac-
tised as solicitor before he joined the
bar in 1850, but he was admitted nine
years later than Mr. Emmerson.
