THE HOMES OF VICE

INDICTMENT OF ELGIN LOCAL OPTION HOTELS.

Father Too Timid to Act—Asked the Almighty to Close Den Which Was Ruining His Boy, But Would Not Prosecute.
Aylmer, Oct. 3.—After disposing of the Butler-Hepburn case, yesterday, and suspending sentence till Tuesday next, Magistrate Hunt addressed the crowd in the court room:
"I want to say, because I see a good many ratepayers here, that I consider it in the interests of the public, and especially of the young people, that these public houses, licensed or unlicensed, should be conducted in a moral way. We have had in parts of Elgin county, in Yorkmouth and Southwick, for instance, local option elections. Women and men excited in these elections. They held public meetings and prayer meetings to ask that all the public houses in the county should be closed, and what is the result? The result is that in the rooms of having licensed hotels we have in a good many cases, not to all, and not to many, houses I know whereof I am talking. I am out through the county two or three times a week. Going by these places I see from ten to twenty girls tied up by these unlicensed houses and I know that in every one of these girls there is a man and a woman, and often a girl who is four or five years older than I see many girls going there almost every night from the city (St. Thomas), and many young men, too. I want you to put a stop to it."
"I said, 'How do you mean this?'"
"He answered, 'I have watched it with my own eyes.'"
"I said to him, 'You lay the information on it. I will take care to look after the matter.'"
"But," continued the magistrate, "he did not want to do this for fear, he said, of creating a riot. Then I told him to file the information anyway, and I would subpoena his boy. His answer was, 'Squire, I am afraid my boy will not tell the truth, and he declined to lay the information.'"
"Two or three nights later there was a raucous meeting, and this same man asked Almighty to close the hotel that lousy house. I am afraid that in the day of judgment the Almighty will want to rule him out of court for contempt of court."
"I said to him, 'If you do not lay the information on it, the Almighty to shut up that house, that man and his friends should have got a hustle on, secured the evidence necessary to prosecute the case, and I would have done the rest.'"
Premier Was Shocked.
Toronto, Oct. 3.—Premier Whitney expressed his surprise at the improprietous conditions which Magistrate Hunt, of Orwell, East Elgin, says exist in parts of Elgin county, when Premier Whitney was asked "if he considered Magistrate Hunt's statement, replied: "Yes, I have seen it, and I may say that it seems to me that if this condition really existed the government should, and will find a remedy for it."

JUSTICE DUFF.

He is Son of a Congregational Minister.
Justice Duff, whose promotion from the bench of British Columbia to the supreme court of Canada is announced, is probably the youngest man who has worn the ermine in the dominion. His father was Rev. Charles Duff, one of the best beloved of the Congregational ministers in the province. It was while Mr. Duff was pastor at Mesford—that Lyman was born. He was a brilliant student and taught mathematics and the sciences. Mr. Duff practised for a time in Ferris, but went west shortly after his admission to the bar. He located at Victoria, B.C., became interested in constitutional law, and by 1903 his position at the bar was so well recognized that he was associated with Mr. Blake and Christopher Robinson in the Alaska boundary arbitration. Shortly after his return from Europe he was elevated to the bench. Justice Duff is essentially a public spirit. He will hardly go to sleep even in the serene atmosphere of the supreme court.

A PREFERENCE.

Will Be Available if Canada Wants It.
Ottawa, Ont., Oct. 4.—J. S. Larko, Canada's commercial agent in Australia, in a report to the trade and commerce department, expresses the opinion that if Canada made overtures to the Commonwealth government, she probably obtain the same tariff preferences as Britain and New Zealand have already enjoyed in the Australian markets.
Mr. Larko adds that if this preference was extended to Canadian products it would prove highly advantageous to Canadian trade.
Somewhere in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, or along the public meeting adjacent, the slapper American yacht Frolic is dodging around with a cargo of smuggled Chinamen on board, waiting a chance to land them in the maritime provinces or on the New England coast.

THE WORST FEARED.

A Great Many Men Are Embombed.
Pocahontas, Va., Oct. 4.—An explosion of the St. Paul entry of the west mine of the Pocahontas Collieries company, occurred last yesterday afternoon. There are at least sixty to one hundred men embombed in the mine, with hardly a reasonable chance of their escape on account of the mud that has been put in being put forth to reach them, but none have yet been recovered. Several men have been rescued, but they are all in a state of being their doomed comrades. Hundreds of people are crowded about the entrance to the mine, making anxious enquiries for friends and relatives. The cause of the explosion has not yet been determined.

Beroche, K.C., who is watching the case for the crown, has thought best to "adjourn" the inquest so as to have the G.T.R. officials present if they wished to cross-examine the witnesses.
Adjourned until next Wednesday evening.
