SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN

By every numbered section from Lange in Manitoba to West. It is a record of the progress of the Dominion in the past year.

Application for homesteads must be made in person at the office of the Surveyor-General, at the Ottawa office of the Surveyor-General.

At least six months' residence on the land is required before the title can be granted. The land must be in the hands of the settler at the time of the application.

Coal—Coal lands may be located by the holder of a mining lease. The coal must be in the hands of the settler at the time of the application.

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
