

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOME TEAD REGULATIONS, Any even numbered section of Domin-n Lands in Manitoba or the Northrovince, excepting 8 and 26, not over 18 years of age, to the extent of onequarter section, of 160 acres, more or instruction for homestead entry or in petion must be made in person by the

A homesteader whose entry is in good standing and not liable to cancellation, may, subject to approval of Department, relinguish it in favour of father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, if eligible, but to be one elso, on filing declaration of abandonment.

Where an entry is summarily cancelled or voluntarily abandoned, subsequent to institution of carcellation proceedings, the applicant for inspection will be entitled to prior right of entry.

Applicants for inspection must state in what particulars the homesteader is in default, and if subsequentry the statement is found to be incorrect in material particulars, the applicant will lose any prior right of re-entry should the land become vacant, or if entry has been granted it may be summarily cancelled.

Duties.—A settler is required to perform the conditions under one of the following plans:—

(1) At least six months' residence up year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such homesteader the requirement as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother. father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirement may be satisfied by

Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Do-minion Lands at Ottawa, of his inten-SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST MINING REGULATIONS. Coal.—Coal lands may be purchased at \$10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual or company. Royalty at the rate of ten cents per ton of 2,000 pounds shall be

Quartz.—A free miner's certificate is granted upon payment in advance of \$5 per annum for an individual, and from \$50 to \$100 per annum for a company according to capital. A free miner, having discovered minerin place, may locate a claim 1,500x The fee for recording a claim is \$5. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may. upon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 per acre.

The patent provides for the reyment of a royalty of 2½ per cent on the sales.

Placer mining claims generally are 100 feet square entry fee \$5, renewable

A free miner may obtain two leases to dredge for gold of five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the Interior. The lessee shall have a dredge in operation within one season from the date of the lease for each five miles. Rental \$10 per annum for each mile of river leased. Royalty at the rate of 21 per cent collected on the output after it exseds \$10,000.




