Political Events In England.

John Redmond, who leads Nationalists, and who is so fervent in his service, writes to the party that he expects great things from the British parliament which is now open. He has reason to believe that the Bannerman government will do something for Ireland. There will be legislation in the way of home rule, and Mr. Redmond and some of his associates will be presently given an opportunity to study the measure and make suggestions with regard to it.

The Nationalists are cautious meanwhile and non-committal. Catch them taking precipitate action! They want to see what the measure is like before undertaking to help it through. At the same time Mr. Redmond had an experience that will not be cast from him. He knows what happened when Mr. Gladstone failed with his home rule bill. The government went out of office, and home rule as a possibility faded from view. From the Bannerman government the Nationalists will get some legislative relief. From the opposition—the section led by Chamberlain, or the section led by Balfour—nothing can be had. The lesson of the hour is obvious.

There are two parties in parliament which can affect very much the fortunes of the government—the labour and Irish contingents. One has a compensation bill which may be passed by the Commons, but not by the Lords. The other has the local parliament for Ireland bill, which will be surely blocked by the Lords if it sets that far. The government has an education bill, however, which depends upon the harmony of its supporters, and it will
