LIVE STOCK PRICES.

Paid at Various Centres in the Country.

Toronto Junction, Oct. 22.—At the Union Stock Yards, the quality of fat cattle was medium; the trade was dull; export prices ranged from \$4.25 to \$4.60, the bulk selling at \$4.30 to \$4.50. Export bulls sold at \$3.60 to \$4.25. Butcher's prices for picked lots of choice ranged from \$4.30 to \$4.50; good from \$4 to \$4.35; medium, \$3.50 to \$3.85; common, \$3.15 to \$3.30; butcher cows, \$2 to \$3.25; runners, \$2.50 to \$3.25. Veal calves sold at \$3.50 to \$6.50 per cwt. Milch cows and springers at \$35 to \$55. Export ewes from \$4 to \$4.50; bucks, \$3 to \$3.50; spring lambs, \$5 to \$5.50. Hogs, select sold at \$6.25; light, \$6.

Montreal, Oct. 22.—There were about 1,400 head of butchers' cattle, 30 milch cows, 250 calves, 1,500 sheep and lambs, and 400 fat hogs offered for sale at the East End Abattoir to-day. There was a good demand and slightly higher prices paid for the best cattle, but the common and inferior beasts were slow of sale. Prime beefers sold at 4c. to a little over 4c.; pretty good animals, 3c. to 4c., and the common stock, 2c. to 3c. per lb., while the lean canners sold at about 1c. per lb. Milch cows sold at from \$30 to \$35 each. Most of the calves were lean grassers, some of them being little more than skin and bones; these sold at about 2c. per lb.; good veal bringing 4c. to 5c. per lb. Sheep sold at 3c. to 4c. per lb., and the lambs at 5c. to 6c. per lb. Fat hogs are lower at from 6c. to 6c. per lb. for good lots.

NEW MAGAZINE — "WOMAN."

The Sixth of the Munsey Company's Publications.

The Frank A. Munsey company has, with the addition of its newest magazine "Woman," increased the total number of its monthly publications to six. The oldest one of the six is The Argosy, which is now nearly twenty-four years old. The others are Munsey's, The All-Story, The Scrap Book and The Railroad Man's Magazine. The total circulation of these six magazines is over 2,200,000 copies and the amount of fiction issued by this one publishing house every thirty days, is said to weigh over five tons.

"Woman" is a straight reading magazine, making up for its lack of illustrations by its wealth of stories, articles and departments. It was apparently built on the principle that a woman would rather read a good story than glance over a few pages of more or less interesting illustrations. The principle is undoubtedly a sound one, when the stories are as much worth reading as those in the November "Woman."

The first number indicates that Mr. Munsey has again accomplished a seeming impossibility in finding a new field for a new magazine. This is, however, as it should be, for since Mr. Munsey introduced the first ten-cent magazine, the publishing world has gotten more or less into the habit of waiting to see what he will do next. "Woman" is his latest answer and a very good one.

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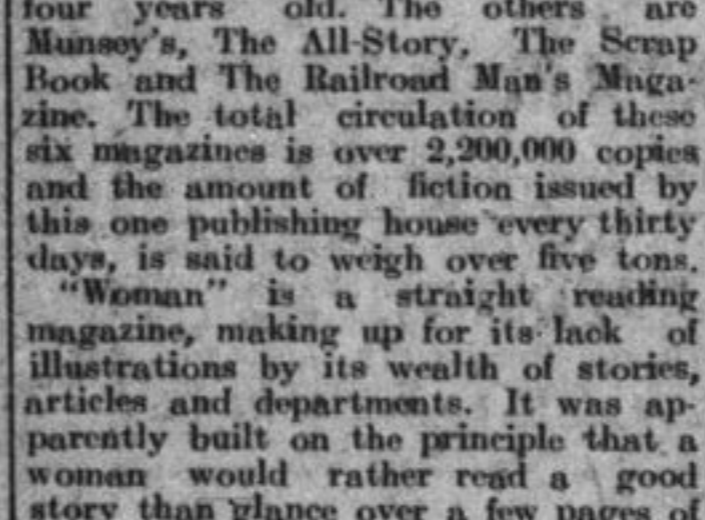

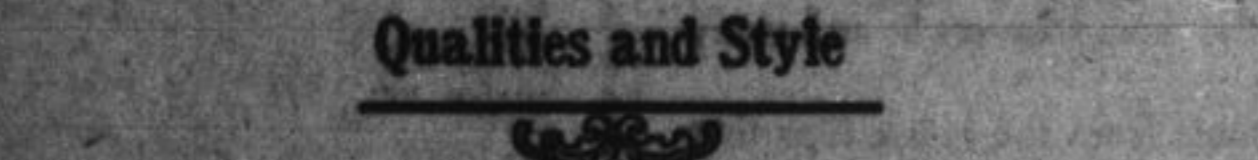
