So long as the prices of labor and material and provisions increase, rents must also take balloon ascension. There was a raise in rents on May 1st last. Now, November 1st, the beginning of the yearly and half-yearly periods, has seen a demand from quite a number of landlords for increased rent, or the dwellers in their houses had the option of going elsewhere. 
