Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Province, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male results. Rev. Where an entry is summarily cancelled Applicants for inspection must state in court here, on Friday. Duties.—A cettler is required to perform the conditions under one of the following plans:—
