

OF THE CITY'S SEWAGE IS EXPLAINED.

By City Engineer Beckwith-The Sewage Goes Through Tanks in Which it is Decomposed. Kingston will very soon require to have its sewage undergo septic treatnent. The following explanation of the process is given by City Engineer Beckwith:

"The septic treatment of sewage, un

like other processes, has for its object the favoring of decomposition or putrefaction, and to do this the sew age is confined to tanks from which all light and as much air as possible are excluded.
