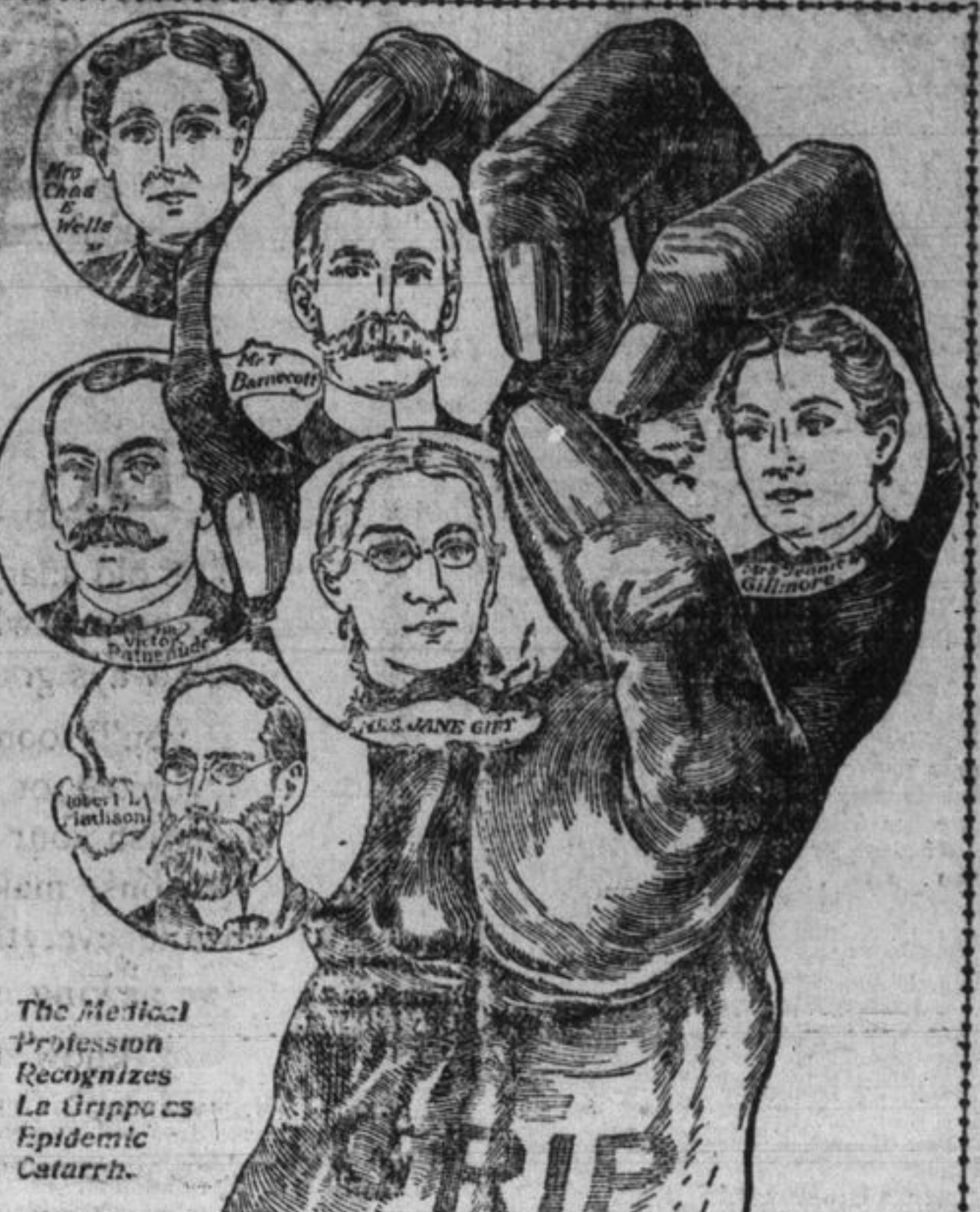

THE IRISH PROPOSALS

IRISH LEGISLATION TO GO BEFORE BRITISH COMMONS.

Powers of the Proposed Irish Council Defined—Irish Secretary to Be Chairman—Irish Boards to Be Abolished—Financial Arrangements—Powers to Be Devolved Those Generally Grouped Under the Head of "Local Government."

Further information has been received as to the manner in which the Irish proposals will be carried out. All the members of the Irish Council or the members of their respective committees. The new Council will consist of 103 members—the number of the Irish members in the House of Commons will be 25, and the number of the members of the House of Lords will be 10.

An important office may be given to the Chief Secretary in the scheme. He would be the chief executive officer of the Irish Council. Like the Speaker of the House of Commons, he would take no part in debate, and only vote when the House was divided.

The scheme includes a reorganization of the Irish Government. The many Irish Boards will be recast into a few well-defined and compact departments, such as education, agriculture, and public works.

Financial Arrangements. The financial arrangements will be the crux of the scheme. Simplicity in the budget is the keynote of the proposals.

UPON MESSRS. POPE AND FOWLER.

The Ottawa Citizen Speaks Upon the Pope-Fowler Land Matter—Their Connection With Mackenzie and Mann.

Ottawa, Nov. 10.—The Citizen, the local conservative organ, in an editorial, headed "The Pope-Fowler Land," concludes as follows: "There is, unfortunately, in another point of view, in the opinion of the Citizen, reflects most seriously on Messrs.
