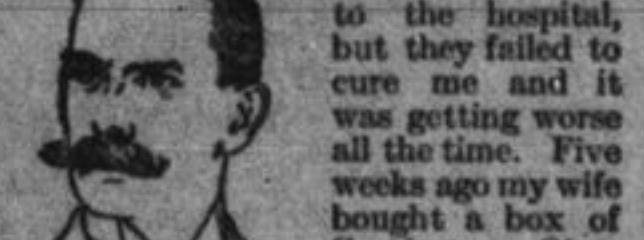

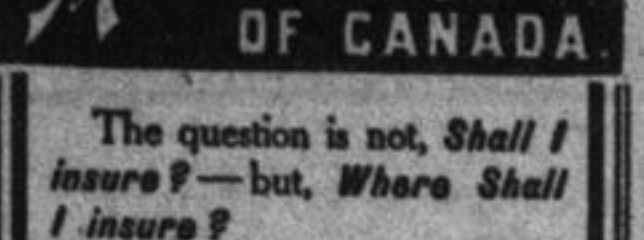

THINGS THEATRICAL

NOTES ABOUT PLAYS, PLAYERS AND PLAYHOUSES.

First English Production of "Peer Gynt" - Southern and Marlowe Playing in "John the Baptist."

Henry Arthur Jones, the great English playwright, has crossed the Atlantic in order to give a series of lectures on the drama.

The premier in the United States of Herman Sudemann's play, "John the Baptist," took place on Tuesday night in Philadelphia.

"The Bella of London Town," is the name of the new musical play in which Camille D'Arville will return to the stage on November 12th.

Miss Lena Ashwell, now appearing in New York, was born on Nelson's old flagship, the Boscawen, while her parents were cruising in the North Sea.

The first production of "The Lilac Room," an English comedy, took place last Monday in Norfolk, Amelia Bingham did herself great credit in the leading role.

John May, in her coming play, "Nelly Bland," who tries to convey "Simple Life," to a more healthy mode of living.

Caroline Lovell, who retired in 1857 after a successful career of twenty-five years, died at the home of her daughter in Englewood, N.J., last week at the age of eighty-nine.

Louis Mann and Clara Lipman, who are going to London with "Julie Bon Bon," will sail with their company, November 14th. They open at the Waldorf theatre, ten days later.

Henry Miller's production of Brownie's "Pippin Passes," with Mrs. Le Moyne as Ottina and Montemur had its first performance at the Lyric Theatre, New York, on Friday afternoon.

Five generations of Jeffersons have played Lip Van Winkle in Chicago, the fifth being Thomas Jefferson, who opened at McVickers, October 21st, in the play made famous by his forefathers.

The Ben Grant players began their fifth American tour on October 25th, at the University of Virginia, presenting "Everyman." Mr. Grant may receive the "Play and Faces" in which he has played the part of Triplet over a thousand times.

Brooklyn is getting all the best attractions this season and business is good at the theatres. "His Honor, the Mayor," is doing nicely at Teller's, Broadway. Virginia Harriet is at the Shubert, and "Mrs. Wiggs of the Cabbage Patch" is at the new Montauk.

Leo Dittichstein, the actor-author has in preparation a serious play of American life entitled "The Writing on the Wall," and a new comedy from the Germans, "Lulu's Husband." He is collaborating with Percival Pollard on another comedy, soon to be produced.

Alla Nazimoff, the Russian actress, is said to have acquired a knowledge of English language during the few months she has spent in America. Under the direction of Henry Miller she will shortly be seen in a series of plays given in English.

TO ATTEND SCHOOL

EDUCATION OF BOBBIES IN ENGLISH CAPITAL.

Essays on Murder - Stalwart Constables Seek to Gain Knowledge Neglected or Denied in Youth.

London, Nov. 10. - The fact, as stated by Sir Edward Henry, the chief commissioner of police, to the Royal Commission, on Tuesday, that reports of police constables are often extremely illiterate, many constables finding it difficult to write reports owing to their defective education.

"We specialize on burglaries and murders," said the teacher, "imagine any one of us, for instance, to be picked up by one of the desks, it proved an account of a ghastly crime in a free, bold hand by a constable, who was imagining the circumstances in which he found a murdered man's body. A second paper was an essay on cats, setting forth the law both as it affects 'catby' and his 'fars,' and a third dealt with a constable's paper told how an arrow is made, and a fourth dealt with the removal of dead bodies.

"I have a police code," explained the teacher, "for my guidance, and I use that as a basis for the lessons. After a lesson-to-day the subject was perjury-the men get to work on reports and essays. They are also taught arithmetic, and they do a little reading, but the main subject is composition.

"Very few of the men were born in London; nearly all of them come from other countries. Their attainments are very diverse. Many of them are not above the level of attainment of a boy in the fourth standard."

OUR STRANGE DREAMS

Are Jumble of Inherited Ideas.

I think very often our dreams are a jumble of ideas that we have inherited, and that dreaming is largely a jumble of our own ideas.

We dream of things which we have never experienced in our waking moments. I remember a very realistic dream. It was a battle, and I was in a regiment of cavalry that received an order to charge. The whole scene is vividly before me as I write, and were I an artist I could sketch the face of a man who rode by my side, I can tell the thrum of his galloping, the clanging of the horse's hoofs in the mad rush as we quickened our pace to get closer to those we were pursuing.

Suddenly the squadron of men in full dress, whirling off to the right and left, and we were left in the iron throats of a masked battery. They opened fire upon us - a moment after the ear-splitting thunder, and I was in a hell of smoke, dust, blood, and metal, every piece seemed to sing a war chant of its own. Then I awoke and I was shouting "God! I never knew it was anything like this."

Here comes a something experienced by an ancestor which has descended from generation to generation and taken its place in my collection of impressions.

THE SWISS FOURTH

No One Knows Name of Swiss President.

August 1st is the Swiss Fourth of July, the national fête day. A traveler tells how he helped to celebrate it one year at one of the climbing centers in the Valais by eating the sumptuous dinner provided by the hotel without extra charge, applauding the fireworks display and a bonfire lighted high on the mountain side, and shouting "Hourra!" at the end of a patriotic speech extolling the ancient military glories and present republican democracy of Switzerland.

Next morning came the strange sequel. The orator of the occasion, the most distinguished native visitor in the place, was appealed to as one who would certainly know the name of the Swiss president, but even he could not remember it. Nobody ever can. The name of that unassuming functionary is always less familiar in Switzerland than that of the lieutenant-governor in Illinois. He is merely the democracy's temporary official.

Wild Geese As Decoys. Two brothers named Frakes, living in Kansas, have wild game with clipper wings, which they use as decoys. One night Frank Frakes heard wild geese flying around his house in answer to the calls of his trained decoys. He went to the door in his night clothes and killed five. On another occasion a lot of wild geese lit in the yard with his decoys. He hastily rigged up a fish net, drove them all into it and captured three wild ones. The Frakes boys take ten decoys to the river, tie them on a sand bar, and then wait in a blind until the wild geese appear. As soon as wild geese appear the decoys set up a wild cry, and the wild geese always sail around. In April, three years ago, Frank and Mace Frakes killed seventeen geese in one day; eighteen the next, and thirty the next. That was the best record they ever made.

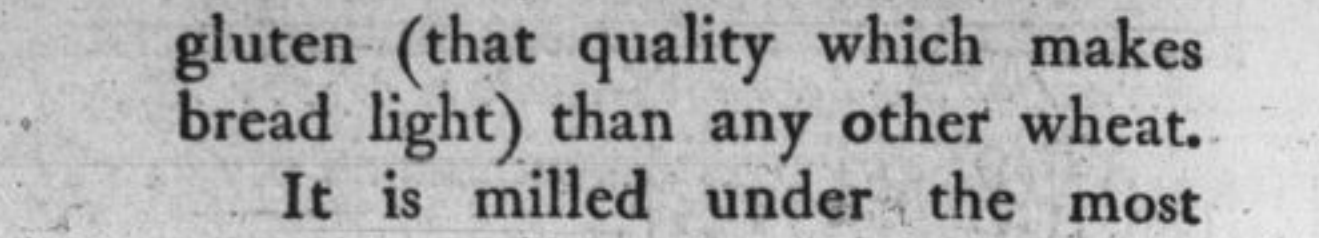

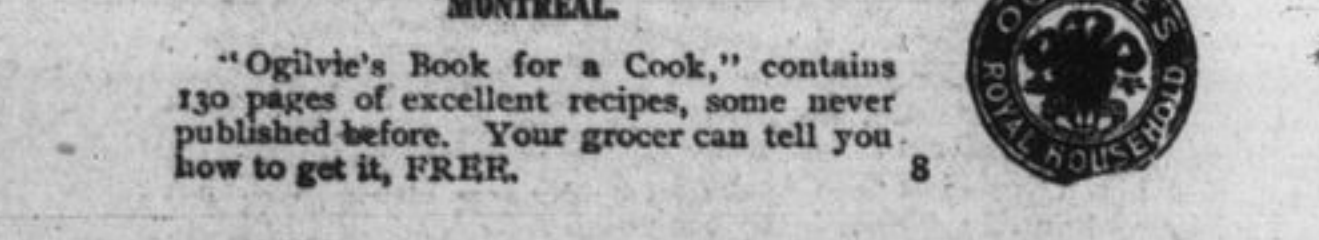

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WESTERN REGULATION

Any even numbered section of the North West, excepting 8 and 20 reserved, may be homesteaded by person the sole head of a family, or over 21 years of age, who has the quarter section, of 160 acres, or less.

Application for homestead entry of section must be made in person by applicant at the office of the local U.S. Sub-agent.

An application for entry or improvement personally made by the applicant may be wired to the local Agent in Sub-agent at the residence of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram application is to have priority and land will be held until the necessary papers to complete the entry are received by mail.

In case of "perfection" the entry must be cancelled and the land will be held until the necessary papers to complete the entry are received by mail.

(1) At least six months' residence on and cultivation of the land in year during the term of three years.

(2) If the land is in a section of 160 acres or more, the applicant must reside upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for such homestead residence as to be inspected and satisfied by such person residing with or near the land.

(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for such homestead residence, the applicant will not be required to reside upon the land.

Before making application for the better land, the applicant must in writing to the Commissioner of Indian Lands at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WESTERN MINING REGULATION

Coal—Coal lands may be purchased for \$10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 per acre for anthracite. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by any individual company. Royalty at the rate of 10 cents per ton of 2,000 pounds collected on the gross output.

Quartz—A fee miner's certificate granted upon payment in advance per annum for an individual, and \$10 to \$100 per annum for a corporation, according to capital.

A free miner, having discovered a lode, may locate a claim of 1,500 feet.

The fee for recording a claim is at least \$100 must be expended each year or paid to the recorder in lieu of payment. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may having a survey made, and complying with other requirements of the law, at \$1 per acre.

The instant provisions shall apply to a royalty of 2 1/2 per cent on the value of the mineral claims generally a foot square entry for \$5, renewal fee \$10.

A free miner may obtain two lead dredges for gold of five miles each term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the Interior. The lessee may have a dredge in the alluvium within one square mile of the lease for each five miles of leased. Royalty at the rate of 10 per cent collected on the output at 10 cents \$10,000.
