COMMERCIAL MATTERS.

That is Going On in the Business World—The Markets.

St. Paul, Canada, has shipped 1,000 tons to the United States markets. The Japan-China corporation has been set up for an office on Bay Street, Winnipeg, with a capital of \$2,000,000.

The C.P.R. has contracted for 1,000 horsepower for the new electric power company for their works at Fort William.

C.P.R. freight for the second week of October totalled \$1,449,000 an increase of \$129,000 over the same week in 1909.

Grand Trunk Railway System traffic is 575,000 tons from Nov. 15 to 14, 1910, \$988,200; 1909, \$793,900; increase, \$194,300.

H. H. Harriman is reported as saying to a friend: "Union Pacific will settle in an investment bond worth \$1,225, while Southern Pacific will work to 150 or 175."

At the close of business on Oct. 21st, 1909, there were in existence in the United States \$222,222,222 national banking notes of \$5,000 each.

Within the next six weeks the Algoma steel company will complete its new open hearth furnace, which will greatly increase its output and make it possible for the concern to enter the structural steel field within the near future.

The U.S. crop of corn is 178,000,000 bushels greater than in any former year, and the farmers are having trouble finding help to take care of the grain.
