The Outlook in Ottawa.

The appeal of Mr. Fielding in his late Montreal address, for a larger political vision, for the consideration of Canada's greater good, will find a ready response in the hearts of many men.

Parliament is again open, and under promising conditions. The plan is to proceed at once to business, and to dispatch it with expedition and yet due care for the importance of every issue. In the expenditure of eighty millions of dollars, as Mr. Fielding explains, it is possible that some errors of judgment will occur, or some "mistakes" as the friends of the Whitney government like to put it. These are entitled to attention in passing. Any transaction which is not proper in the eyes of the public, and the sharper it is the more corrective it will be in its character.

There is more to talk of, however, than scandals. Last session was rank and ill-smelling so far as four or five petty campaigners could make it, and while they were pledged to blacken the characters of liberals they were themselves, in subsequent events proved, guilty of transactions that looked very bad when described in print.

The tone of debate is largely determined by the attitude of the leaders. Sir Wilfrid Laurier stands always for dignity and decorum. He screens no wrongdoing. He lends himself to no unworthy debate. He holds his followers in check. Mr. Borden, on the other hand, while courteous and dignified himself, has no control of his supporters, and they run riot occasionally. There may be a change of government in the dominion some day, but it will be when the conservatives abandon their present policies and carry themselves as men to whom the people can safely trust the direction of this young nation.

Whitney And His Mistakes.

The educational policy of the Ontario government is unpopular. Of this there have been many evidences. Here is one conservative remark made to the Whig recently: "In the most annual to the people the government without benefit in making the minister of education a mere grammarophone of the one who in reality exercises the functions of the minister of education and does his work. At best the plan is expensive, circular and uncertain. Under a minister of education who is really fit for his position there is no room for a superintendent of education. If a superintendent of education is not fit for his position why should he be there, should there be an expensive office that are not required, and for which there is no room."

Dealing with the law respecting the salaries of teachers, Mr. Scott writes: "The fact also, that a minimum salary has been prescribed by law shows that we have already got the first taste of a bureaucratic or departmental system whereby freedom of contract is taken away. That the provision is wrong in this country is evident. That it is plainly very wrong in a county like this where thirty permits have to be given to teachers without any qualifications, in order to keep the schools open, goes for the saying, and proves conclusively that Mr. Whitney's pre-lection utterances about our public schools greatly standing in need of something to be done for them were very closely and busy deliberations."

Mr. Scott is a conservative who believes in being candid. He does not mince matters. He is against the choice of the minister of education and superintendent, and he is satisfied that the law which Mr. Whitney handed out, as a model of its kind, is not going to work. A few criticisms like his will make a contribution to the country. The Reform people will read it with a great deal of interest. The government has wanted to be regarded as one that "did some thing," and the Spectator says it must be excused if it makes some mistakes. It all depends on what those mistakes are.

Purifying The Parties.

There is nothing like a hot election to produce bad blood politically and personally. The tumult in New York state, following the recent election, is very remarkable. Both the great parties have been grievously disappointed. The republicans had control of the patronage for several years and made mischief by its dispensation. It catered to the men in power, to the trusts, the monopolies, to the hay it will be through Saskatchewan.

There are two exceptionally wide strong veins in the property which has, of course, passed government inspection as a valuable discovery, and several smaller calcite veins carrying silver. The government map shows the property to be intersected by what is termed a "contact" of two different formations and it is now a proven fact that nearly all the bonanza veins carrying values of many thousand dollars to the ton are situated on such contacts. It is the opinion of those on the ground that the Empress will prove to be as rich as any property around Cobalt and that with such a moderate capitalization and high-class directorate there will be a big rush for the stock which will no doubt follow the course of all the better Cobalt stocks in quickly advancing to a high premium.
