WILL THE O. R. F. U. CHANGE ITS RULES

And Accept the Swimming Again?—A Motion to Do So Will Be Made at the Annual Meeting on Saturday. In a recent game between a picked New Jersey team and Toronto University team, at New York, Saturday, the Toronto received \$500 for expenses, the same amount as given to Montreal, when the Red and Black went to the Ambitious city. Western Ontario is well represented on the McGill team. Rows is from Toronto, Zimmerman from Hamilton, McLellan from Guelph, Windsor from Stratford and Ballantyne from Galt. Hala is the only Quebec province man on the team. Paris is from the Yukon. At the annual meeting of the Ontario Rugby Football Union in Toronto next Saturday, a motion will be made to amend the Canadian union rules, introducing the scrimmage again into O.R.F.U. ball. In the west, the Canadian rules seem to have been received with favor. The snapback system is not satisfying the people.

Hockey.

Prize at Harrow has named Dr. Gilliland, of Uxbridge and G. H. Hadden, of Port Hope, as its representatives on the Ontario Hockey Association executive. The Manitoba senior hockey clubs disagree upon the question of professional players. The question was thoroughly debated at a meeting Saturday night, and a majority of the delegates voted to ignore the C.A.A.U. and follow the precedents of the eastern leagues. Two senior Winnipeg teams, Victoria and Winnipeg, were opposed to this and promptly withdrew from the league. Forgive the Prairie, Brandon and Kenora will therefore enter professional or senior professional rank, and Winnipeg will be represented by a new team, Strathcona, who will include several well-known players who figured in the professional league last year.

ARE COUNTERFEITERS.

Paris, Dec. 4.—The Paris police have got in touch with another gang of coiners, whose headquarters appear to be somewhere in Spain. Two women, named respectively Blasco and Pons, were caught red-handed at Vincennes while attempting to pass counterfeit two-franc pieces. The woman Blasco, who confessed that her husband was an anarchist and had been arrested two years ago at Barcelona, lived in a miserable hovel on the outskirts of Paris. The detectives, on visiting the place, found a trunk containing over 3,000 counterfeit coins, chiefly 1, 3, and 5 franc French and German pieces, and a number of German marks. Blasco had with her a boy aged eleven, whom she said she had adopted. The boy told the police that the spurious money had been given to the woman by a young Spaniard, who made periodical trips from Spain.

Reception Costume Of Velvet.

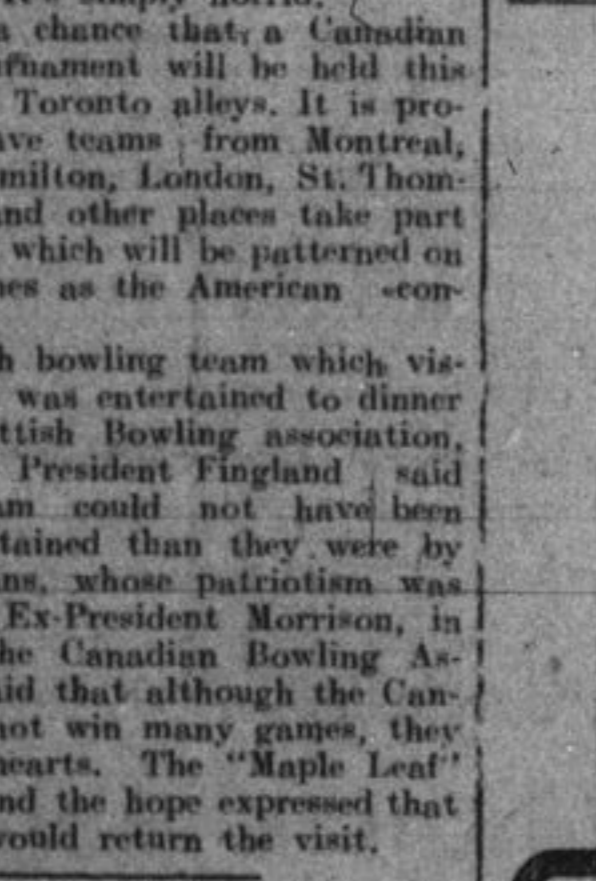

MINISTERS BORE THE RESTLESS KAISER WITH THEIR DULLNESS.

When Obligated to Hear Their Reports He Plays With His Dogs—Partial to Americans. Berlin, Dec. 4.—A considerable sensation has been created by the publication of a pamphlet entitled "The Kaiser and His People: German Misgovernment by a Jesuitist," the author is evidently, as the publishers describe him, "an emigrant to the United States," who is behind the scenes of political life in Germany. He depicts the emperor, in defiance of all accepted notions, as a man who does not take a really serious interest in the administrative affairs of the country. Prince Bismarck, he says, gave his success with his mastery to his unique capacity for eliminating from his reports all dry, needful facts, and for presenting his information in an extremely condensed and entertaining form. The emperor, adds the eminent politician, hates dull details, and is ever anxious to escape conversation of the burden of the concrete and to fly away on the wings of imaginative generalities. An extremely amusing account is given of his majesty's method of dealing with dull reports. "He listens with barely concealed impatience to their pedantic statements, playing the while with his dogbands, which he chases round the room until they get so tired in the legs of the ministers' Count's Countess, who is seated who forthwith becomes confused, loses the thread of his discourse and is immediately dismissed to his home with mocking words of consolation from the emperor. His majesty does not tolerate the least familiarity from his own subjects, but he associates with Americans on terms of free and easy familiarity. During the "Riel" episode, says Allison Armour, was again a striking instance on the shoulder and Mr. Vanderbilt with a smile told his majesty that he was a good fellow. The emperor is a great admirer of the pianist, and a specialist with them for pleasure, and with the intention of gaining valuable knowledge of the great modern world where racial and liberty and science are believed to meet fully developed."

NATIVES ASTONISHED.

First White Woman to Cross Dark Africa. Brussels, Dec. 4.—The first white woman to cross Africa to the Cape, wife of Commandant Cabra, of the Belgian army, has just returned to Belgium by the Congo steamer, Brusselsville. Mrs. Cabra left her native land with her husband in April, 1905, starting from Naples for Dar-es-Salaam, in German East Africa, going thence to Zanzibar, Kotonou and Entebbe, the capital of Uganda. Thence they travelled by caravan to Lake Albert and to M'abari, in the Congo, crossed the Democratic range, and for a month journeyed down the Congo river toward the coast. Madame Cabra states that she met with no terrible difficulties, but some of her experiences are amusing, particularly the astonishment of the natives at the sight of the first white woman they had seen. A native chief, who declared he had never believed in the existence of white women, confessed, when asked how he thought the white race was continued, that "he had not thought of that."

SAVED BY AN INDIAN.

Jealous Elephant Attacks His Keeper. Berlin, Dec. 4.—Her Schiller, chief keeper of the Berlin Zoo, was yesterday the victim of a murderous attack by "Harry," a famous Indian elephant. His injuries are said to be fatal. On entering the cage the keeper had to pass the elephant's mate, which was shortly giving birth to a calf. Apparently fearing that Schiller intended some harm to the female, Harry, who had been eyeing him viciously, advanced and pinioned him violently against the bars of the cage with the crushing weight of his gigantic forehead. Schiller was able to shout for help, and the first to appear was a young Sikh named Sukko, who trained Harry in India and brought him to Europe. A single word from Sukko caused the elephant to release Schiller, but the keeper swooned from agonizing internal pains. Harry is one of the largest elephants in Europe. Only twenty-six years old, he is the particular pet of Berlin children, but, as he has committed three previous attacks on Schiller, he will now probably be sentenced to death.
