MADRID EXCITED OVER THE POLITICAL CRISIS THERE.

Noisy Groups, Carrying Red
Banners, Gather in the Streets
—Police Out and Troops in
Readiness For Outbreak.

Madrid, Dec. 1.—The city is much excited over the political crisis, noisy groups, carrying red banners, gathered last evening in the neighborhood of the Senate chamber, and shouted threateningly. The police scattered them, and arrested several persons, but the crowds gathered again, and their numbers constantly increased. As the excitement abated, the crowds focused in the Puerta Del Sol, outside the ministry of the interior.

At a late hour, a great force of police was out, and the governor was holding troops in readiness in case their services were necessary. Nevertheless, it was hoped the night would pass without a serious outbreak.



EXHIBITION OF NERVE.

Paris, Dec. 4.—M. Lepine, the courageous prefect of police, is the hero of the hour in Paris. Sunday morning 1,000 workers went shouting after inflammatory speeches at the labor exchange, decided to march on the Hotel de Ville and demand a Sunday rest, the right to be put into instant operation and shops closed immediately by force. But the municipal palace was guarded by a strong force of police, and so the angry manifestations resolved to march on the prefecture. M. Lepine in person. The excited and growing crowd, shouting "Down with the municipal council!" and "Long live the law!" therefore turned their backs on the Hotel de Ville, but when they arrived at the prefecture of police an air of official calm pervaded the building, and on the arrival of Lepine he stood with hands in his pockets of his topcoat and smoking a cigarette, there being no sign of police or soldiers. As soon as the excited crowd came up, the prefect surrounded the prefect and commenced shouting, "Vive Lepine!" The prefect immediately told them to stop, "Come to get off the pavement." They attempted to climb over him, but the little, like man, with fire in his eye, ordered them to do as he bid, and himself pushed them back step by step until the pavement was completely cleared. The prefect then announced that he was willing to receive a delegation, and after a few words of paternal advice the vast crowd, converted from an angry, dangerous temper to a reasonable, pacific mood, broke up and went home.

The Very Latest Celled From All
