AFTER ELEVATION Baron Courtney Says Imperialism is Temptation of the Devil-Lords Needed Because Com-

London, Bec. 8.-Leonard Henry Courtney, long prominent as a government official, and well known as an independent thinker, speaker, peace advocate and denouncer of the Boer war, was dined, last night, by friends to the House of Lords, upon which occasion he took the title of Baron PRODIGAL WRECKS GIGAN-
