BLOWS OUT BRAINS

PRINZESSIN VICTORIA RUNS ON JAMAICA COAST.

Suicide Follows Accident—Steamer's Passengers Safely Landed—Was on Return Trip to New York.

Kingston, Jamaica, Dec. 19.—The Hamburg-American line tourist steamer Prinzessin Victoria Louise went ashore, Monday night, off Port Royal, whereupon Capt. Braininwig, her commander, blew out his brains in his cabin. The steamer's passengers were all safely landed. The vessel was on her return trip to New York, which she left for this port December 12th. She is plying heavily, and the seas are breaking over her, but it is yet hoped she can be saved. She is on a rocky ledge. The German cruiser Bremen is trying to float her, and the French training ship Dugay-Trouin is preparing to leave port to assist. The captain's body is yet aboard his stranded ship.

The Victoria Louise went ashore because she had no pilot, and the captain who was in charge of her following a wrong course, and piled the steamer up on the rocks near his lighthouse. He locked himself in his cabin two hours afterwards and killed himself. The steamer's officers and the German consul here tried vainly to conceal the tragedy.

The police will take charge of the body and have an autopsy. The captain will probably be buried in New York.

The sea was calm when the vessel struck, but the passengers became panic-stricken, and much disorder ensued until they learned that there was no immediate danger. Their transfer to Kingston was without mishap. They are now quartered at hotels here. The weather grew heavy after the accident.

"MILLIONAIRE-PHOBIA"

Chancellor Day of Syracuse Defends the Wealthy.

New York, Dec. 19.—Chancellor Day of Syracuse University, whose championship of John D. Rockefeller and the Standard Oil company, a few weeks ago, was widely quoted, attacks in a forthcoming issue of Leslie's Weekly what he terms "millionaire-phobia" or the movement toward legislative control of vast wealth. He says in part: "For some time we have been in the grip of this mighty spasm over corporate wealth and swollen fortunes. All of our national ills are being stated in this formula: Down with the rich. Puncture the swollen fortunes. Make the rich poor and all the poor will be rich. Destroy the corporations, hamper them, obstruct them. Sue them in the courts. Assault them in the press. Tie the strings of the filipianisms to them in congress, and bind them, and the individual can have a chance."

Fortunes are not the only things that have swollen, he declares, but salaries and wages as well, while the hours of labor have shrunk, which is another way of swelling wages.

I predict that we are passing through an epoch that will state in future times to our everlasting disgrace and shame. If this mania continues it is not far off to a crash, that will carry down all confidence, confuse all property rights, block the wheels of all progress and wreck not only the millions of the rich, but the laborer's cottage. The demand of the hour is the control of the controller. Swollen fortunes are a thousandfold less dangerous to them in congress, and bind them, and the individual can have a chance."

VERY PROFITABLE

Has Been Past Navigation Season.

Detroit, Mich., Dec. 19.—It is estimated that fully sixty-one million dollars have been paid for carrying freight in lake vessels during the season just closed, coal, iron ore, grain and lumber forming the cargoes. All classes of boats have found the year a very profitable one, none more so than the old style wooden vessels which their owners three years ago considered—useless, and which in many instances this year have earned more than they could have been sold for and the owners still have their boats.

PATRICK ASKS CLEMENCY.

Signs Petition Seeking Life Imprisonment.

New York, Dec. 19.—Lawyer Albert T. Patrick, under sentence for the murder of Millionaire Rice, has signed a petition to Governor Hovers, begging him to commute the death sentence to life imprisonment.

"The final appeal to the governor was signed by Patrick in the death house. John T. Milliken, brother-in-law of Patrick, is the one who insisted that Patrick should ask clemency. It is believed that the governor insisted on a personal letter of appeal from Patrick."

Mason, Mich., Dec. 19.—Cutting a hole through the solid brick wall of the county jail and descending rope ladder from the second story, "Molly Maguire" made her escape some time during last night. "Molly Maguire" was arrested in Lansing charged with shoplifting, and believed by the police to be a criminal of importance in her line of work. Her real name and identity have never been revealed. She is a clever and nifty individual, and baffled the officers who arrested her.
