THE CASUALTY LIST. New York, Dec. 26.—A dispatch from New Orleans says twenty-six killed, five fatally wounded and five seriously hurt was the Christmas casualty list in Louisiana, Mississippi, and Alabama up to nine o'clock last night.

Serious Race Riot. Meridian, Miss., Dec. 26.—Conditions, to-day, at Wabash and Scotch, the scene of the race riots, this week, are regarded as serious. Troops still are on guard and a fresh outbreak is feared. Nearly a score of deaths have occurred.

Jews Were Injured. Bucharest, Dec. 26.—The Zionist congress, in session at Cravova, was invaded, to-day, by members of an anti-Jewish society. A riot ensued during which many Jews were injured. The authorities restored order.

White House Rescued Murdered. Jacksonville, Fla., Dec. 26.—John S. Benjamin was shot and killed here by Charles Chase, a burglar, who had been drinking and, while quarrelling with his wife, drew his revolver and attempted to shoot her. She screamed for help. Benjamin, who had a room in the same apartment house, rushed to her assistance. As he entered the door Chase fired four times in rapid succession, each bullet lodging in Benjamin's body. The wounded man was carried to the hospital but died shortly after reaching there.

SHOT THE BRIDE. MYSTERIOUS SHOOTING OF YOUNG WIFE.
