

"Any wholly unused passenger tickets sold in Canada and presented for redemption at the ticket office, where sold within thirty days from date of expiration of such ticket shall be redeemed immediately by the agent in charge of said ticket office at the price. paid for ticket. The word 'void' must be written by agent in ink heavily across the face of the ticket at the time of its redemption.' Passengers presenting such tickets at tie office where they were not sold will have some delay in having them


