Announcement is made that the Lockwood Street Co. has purchased the property of the Lockwood Street Co. at price reported to be \$1,000,000.

The Santa Clara Raw Sugar Co. has been incorporated in Jersey City by New York and Cuban capitalists. The capital stock is \$2,000,000 of which \$1,000,000 is preferred and \$1,000,000 common.

Statement Read By Mayor Mowat at Nominations.

Appropriate statement of floating liabilities on December 31st, 1906, and assets applicable against such liabilities.

Liabilities.—Debentures and interest due January 1st, 1907, \$30,111,333; bills payable, \$20,000,000; light department, \$2,300; unpaid accounts, \$1,000; trust funds (House of Industry), \$1,400; drain deposit, \$165,455; an average of \$8 cents. This includes \$31,445 for spirits, wines, beer and mineral waters, and \$5,480 for cigars.

Assets.—Cash, \$35,004; bills receivable, \$33,225; taxes (street watering) general (total), \$200; local improvement works, 1906, \$23,031.14; local improvement works, 1905, \$23,000; (Kilb street sewer) \$2,000; stock (gas, water, etc.), \$1,700; gas bills, \$48; Total assets, \$90,772.44.

ALL ARE ARRESTED WHO WILL SHOULDER THE BLAME OF ACCIDENT.

The Operator Had the Signals Properly Set—The Extra Ran By at a Very High Speed—The Number of the Dead.

Washington, D.C., Dec. 31.—The total number of the killed in the recent collision on the Baltimore & Ohio railway at Terracotta, last night, is estimated, this morning at about forty, and the number of injured at fifty.

Engineer Hilderbrand, in charge of the "dead" train, declares that, on account of the dense fog, he was unable to distinguish the signal light at Takoma Park block station tower.

Operator Phillips declares the danger signal was in proper place and that Engineer Hilderbrand's train passed the tower station at a speed of fifty to sixty miles an hour.

General Superintendent Todd has estimated the operator, Mr. Todd intimated the burden of the blame would probably fall on the engineer and the crew of the extra, all of whom have been arrested.
