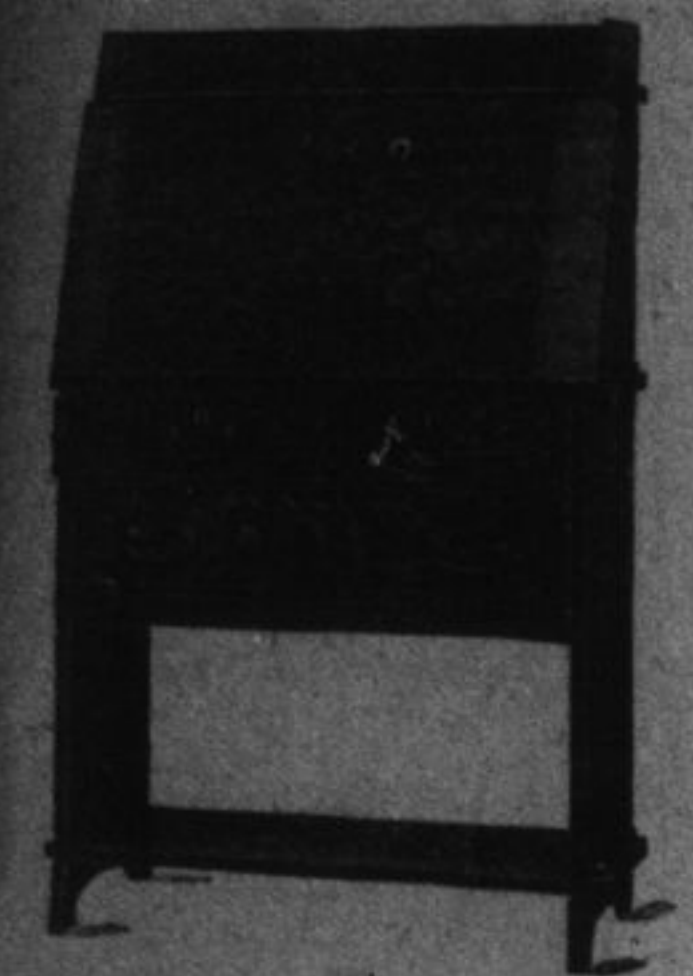

WHAT IS THE CAUSE OF SO MANY TYPHOID FEVER CASES?

Twenty-One Cases Originated Here in Two Months—Chief Came Here For Treatment—Board of Health's Duty.

The Whig has been asked to deal with the typhoid fever question, complaint having been made that the board of health did not look into the origins of the many cases that occurred here during the past two months.

In November, twenty-four cases of typhoid were reported to Medical Health Officer Bell, who at the meeting of the board of health, on December 4th, discussed the matter with the members. He said that out of the twenty-four cases treated here, only thirteen had their origin in Kingston.

LATE WILLIAM NEWLANDS.

After a long illness William Newlands, of 333 Barrie street, passed to rest shortly after two o'clock this morning. He was of Scottish birth, the third son of the late George Newlands, of "Forbeside," Keith, Banffshire, Scotland, where he was born on June 14th, 1831.
