COMMERCIAL MATTERS.

What is Going On in the Business World—The Markets.

There is talk in Boston of a consolidation of the Boston, Montreal and Toronto Copper Companies.

The Southern Pacific railroad company has bought in San Francisco a 47.75 per cent interest in the company's stock, which it will sell at once a \$20,000,000 interest.

Excellent lumbering conditions have prevailed along the upper St. John river and its tributaries, and this year's cut will be heavy up to last year's. The total amount cut by the operators is expected to be between 30,000,000 and 60,000,000 feet.

The New York Journal of Commerce estimates at \$459,710,000 the amount of the losses by fire in the United States and Canada during the year 1906, included in the amount is \$280,000,000 attributable to the disaster in San Francisco. Judging this, however, what is the largest fire loss in any single year, as in those in which Chicago, Boston and Baltimore were devastated.

The fiscal year ended June 30, 1906, produced a record exceeding all former ones in immigration, according to the annual report of Frank P. Sargent, the commissioner-general of immigration. During that period, the number of the population of the United States was increased by the admission of 1,100,745 immigrants, while 65,616 non-immigrant aliens entered its ports, making the total increase 1,166,363.

The annual statement of the St. Lawrence and Chicago Navigation Company for 1906 shows earnings from the steamships for the season of \$11,440,811, as compared with \$10,926,000 in 1905. Out of the earnings a dividend of 10 per cent has been declared amounting to \$1,144,081, and have carried forward \$99,233 to profit and loss making the total result of the account \$11,540,000, as against \$80,577,27 the previous year.

SENT FOR TRIAL

FOR STEALING FROM THE ONTARIO BANK

McGill Will Be Heard Before a Higher Court—The Crown Will Go on With Case Against Cockburn.

Toronto, Jan. 10.—Charles McGill, former manager of the Ontario bank, was formally committed for trial, this morning, on two charges of stealing from the bank. It is unlikely, however, that McGill will be tried at the present session. He was released, on his former bail, the two charges were that McGill had stolen \$136,000 and something over \$1,150,000 from the bank. On the first case the magistrate said it was a clear case of theft, as the money had been traced from Ames & Co., bank to McGill. Upon the second charge the evidence taken by the commission in New York, was accepted by the magistrate. Gibson Grant, who appeared for McGill, objected to this evidence being taken on the ground that it had been irregularly secured, but the magistrate paid no attention to this objection. One of the items of the New York evidence traced the payment of \$2,000 to Mrs. McGill.

The case of G. R. R. Cockburn, former president of the bank, will come up on Monday when the crown said it would be prepared to go on.

The Union Bank, to-day, applied for an injunction against Isaac R. Brigan, Thomas Brigan, E. S. Belknap, Victoria R. Hall, Mary M. Brigan, and the E. J. Smith estate company, of Ottawa, to restrain the defendants from wasting the assets of the estate till the bank has realized upon its claims. Allegations of losses by unwise investments are made by the bank. Judgment was reserved.

Ziba Gallagher, barrister, of this city, applied at the provincial secretary's department, this morning, for a charter incorporating the Kerr Lake Crown Reserve Mining company, limited, with a capitalization of \$2,000,000, in which \$1,000,000 is to be paid in cash. Mr. Gallagher is acting for the syndicate which successfully tendered to the government for the purchase of the deed of Kerr Lake, at a bonus of \$175,000, in addition to the regular 10 per cent on the value of ores mined. The names appearing in the charter, as those of the provisional directors, are: E. M. English, E. C. Berkshaw, E. M. Wilson, W. H. Blain, D. C. McFavish and Percy P. Dean. These gentlemen are said to be really representing the syndicate which purchased the lake. The names of the latter, it is expected, will be made known to-day.

MAY BE RETRIED.

Accessory in the Assassination of Count Bonmartini.

Rome, Jan. 10.—The Bonmartini murder case will probably have to be retried from the beginning.

Dr. Pio Naldi, irritated by his utter abandonment by the Marri family, and also by the news of the Countess Linda's pardon, which has just reached his ears, has made his long-promised resolution of suicide.

The part played in Count Bonmartini's assassination by this presumed actual accomplice of Tullio Marri has always remained obscure, while the existence of a "G" type, which Naldi now professes to disclose the real name and whereabouts of this person. He says that the part he himself undertook in the crime was limited to cutting the corpse into ribbons, a task which was never fulfilled owing to the date fixed for the crime having been postponed for four days at the last moment.

AFTER JOE BAILEY.

Alleged to Have Received Money.

Austin, Texas, Jan. 10.—A resolution providing for a sweeping investigation of the conduct of United States Senator J. W. Bailey was introduced in the house of representatives of the legislature. It is signed by twenty-eight members of the legislature. Senator Bailey's term expires on March 4th.

POISON IN THE TURKEY.

Kingsville, Ont., Jan. 10.—County Crown Attorney Rodd and Provincial Detective Mahoney are investigating a case of wholesale poisoning of the members of a Christmas party, at the home of a prominent resident of this town. It is supposed the poison was in the turkey. Fortunately there were no fatalities.

LYNCHING IN IOWA.

Waterloo, Iowa, Jan. 10.—A crowd of more than 1000 men, last night, battered through the walls of the county jail at Charles City, Ia., with railroad irons, and took James Cullen, and lynched him for wife murder.

SEVEN CHARRD TRUNKS.

Pittsburg, Pa., Jan. 10.—As a result of last night's explosion of molten metal, at the furnaces of the Jones and Laughlin Co., the charred trunks of seven men, who at the time were badly burned, and several other men are missing or injured. Three probably will die.

A DECIDED DECREASE.

Toronto, Jan. 10.—There was a decided decrease in the receipts at the Toronto live stock market last year, the falling off being 15,373 head. The stock handled was: Cattle, 136,703; sheep, 139,408; hogs, 117,297; calves, 23,958; a total value of \$7,683,962.

TETE DE PONT BARRA'S.

THE STRENGTH OF THE HORSE ARTILLERY AT PRESENT.

The present strength of the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery is 264 men and 137 horses. The complete establishment should be 355 men and 260 horses. Lieut.-Col. Fages, commanding, has ordered recruits at various points, including Toronto and Montreal, and when the batteries go to camp at Petawawa next May, they will be right up to strength. At present there are only about sixty men of "B" Battery in Toronto, a number having been returned here lately.

During this slippery weather, it is impossible to use the guns in exercise as accidents would so easily happen, and risk run of spoiling them. Riding exercises are daily indulged in by the men.

An ad recruit is being enlisted in the artillery. One came in yesterday. It is not expected that Artillery Park barracks will be ready for occupation before the middle of February. The renovations have taken longer to complete than anticipated. The de Pont barracks is really overcrowded, and the re-opening of the other barracks will be looked forward to with interest by these men.

Some of the plans for the additions and renovations to be made at Tete de Pont barracks have reached Architect H.P. Smith for approval. All the improvements are nearly completed. It is likely that the renovation work at the lower barracks will be started for a month yet, as none of the buildings can be spared until some of the occupants can move to Artillery Park.

TO FIGHT GAG LAW.

Boycott Every Member Supporting Bill.

Lisbon, Jan. 10.—An interesting struggle on foot here between the government and the press which promises exciting developments. Recently the government brought forward a bill in parliament regulating the rights and liberties of the press, which was generally condemned as being of a reactionary nature.

ADOPTS SUBMARINES.

Thirty of These Craft to Be Added to Navy.

Kiel, Jan. 10.—With the placing in commission, here, yesterday, of Germany's first submarine, "No. 1," the Kaiser's naval advisers have signalled their abandonment of their long-standing mistrust of submarine craft, and will forthwith proceed to make them an important integral part of the imperial fleet.

DESTROYED BY EXPLOSION.

Holidaysburg, Pa., Jan. 10.—The plant and buildings of the Standard Powder company, of Pittsburgh, located at Holidaysburg, were destroyed by an explosion early to-day. No lives were lost. Damage \$100,000.

FELT EARTHQUAKE.

Stockholm, Sweden, Jan. 10.—Two distinct and sharp earthquake shocks were felt at different points in Sweden, at 1.30 o'clock this morning.

VERY QUEER JUSTICE

MURDERER SENTENCED TO BE TWICE BEHEADED.

Is Also Given Two Years' Imprisonment and Deprived of Political Rights.

Berlin, Jan. 10.—Ludwig Teesnow, the child murderer, who has been on trial at Griefswald for the last two days, has been sentenced to death, having been convicted on two separate counts. The verdict condemns him to be beheaded twice, while he is given two years' imprisonment upon the third charge of murderous assault. Finally, he is to suffer loss of his political rights.
