THEY DECLARE IT IS, NOT A COMBINE.

The Aims of the Eastern Canadian Passenger Association Are Very Fully and Clearly Explained.

Montreal Herald. kecently a certain Toronto newspaper has been publishing a series of articles regarding the railways and the board of railway commissioners for Canada. In several of these articles the Eastern Canadian Passenger Asso ciation is referred to as a "comi tion in restraint of trade," The fol lowing statement regarding the poses and work of this association, furnished by a member of its executive committee, will at the present

The purposes of the association are set forth in article 3 of its constitu-

tion as follows: "To promptly secure to each of parties authentic information in rela tion to tariffs, rate sheets and ticket regulations of the respective parties and changes therein, and the due filing and publication thereof; to aid in securing compliance with the laws rela ting to and regulating commerce; and to enable the parties hereto to muually confer, advise and act in rela tion to the subjects above stated, and the proper methods to secure the purposes aforesaid." Article 6 of its constitution provi-

"Each line party hereto shall fix and determine its own reduced fares. . . Nothing in these articles of organization shall be construed as giving authority to the said secretary, the association, or any person or officer of the association to fix or determine any rate for any party hereto, but each party alone shall fix and determine its own rates; and nothing herein shall be construed as prevent ing any party hereto after it has fixed such rates from changing the same from time to time as it may elect." It will be observed that it is distincty provided that each line member of the association reserves always to it self the right to take independent ac tion. Therefore, the accusation that it is a "combination in restraint trade" is absurd on the face of it, pecially when it is considered that the maximum fares of the railways Canada are under the absolute con-

trol of the Canadian railway commission. As clearly set forth above the ordered by the courts to pay \$2,400 transportation lines in the association are organized for the purpose of dealing with applications for reduced rates for excursions, conventions, exhibitions, etc., with the great st possible despatch and uniformity. What would happen if every one of such applications had to be made to each separate transportation line? !t is manifest each line would hesitate to name reduced fares without knowing what its competitors intended to do, not call as to reduced fares but also as dates of sale of tickers, their limits and all other privileges.
