

that no new cases of typhoid fever have been reported to him this year. Half of January has gone, and this announcement is very satisfactory indeed, in view of the large number o cases that occurred during November and December, Dr. Bell says that everything possible was done to trace the origin of the cases, and satisfactory cause was given for each case. He says that no more than was done could be done. The law as it at present exists is not satisfactory, and before the local board of health can exercise the powers it wishes to and should have, it will be necessary to have the health act amended in several respects. The health officers and boards of cities and towns are handicapped the way the law stands just

until the limits are defined.




