Ottawa, Jan. 15.—The farmers of Canada have had a splendid year according to figures reported in a government pamphlet issued to-day.

The wheat crop shows an increase of about thirty per cent., for the larger part of which Western Canada is responsible.

With the grain crop in the neighborhood of eighty-five million bushels, while for the present year it is estimated at ninety million bushels.

Canada's prosperity is largely due to the rapid growth of the western country, the enrichment of western farmers by the high prices for a great volume of product, and the rapid filling of the country by immigration.

Its population has been increased during the year by well over 100,000 immigrants from Britain, the United States and the continent of Europe.
