New York, Jan. 16 .- The following official statement of the effects of the Jamaica earthquake was received here at 10.30 o'clock last night: "Thirty persons were killed and about 300 injured by an parthquake, which struck Kingston, Jamaica, at o'clock, on Monday afternoon. Object to Stipulations in New Act. Members of the Kingston Horticul-tural Society take objection to some of the stipulations in the cultural and arts act.

There appears to be strong opposi tion to the clause respecting horticultural societies, which states that "a society shall not expend more than one-third of its total receipts in one line of work." The act outlines seven ways in which the society can expend the money, and these in-clude the following: Holding exhibits meetings and lectures on horticultural subjects; distribution of seeds and bulbs; by promoting the circulation
