Ottawa, Jan. 18.—The outside service custom officers were entertained to a banquet last night by the officers and members of the Ottawa customs department. One hundred and seventy were present, including the minister of customs and the speaker of the House of Commons.

The minister in replying gave a glowing account of Canada's prosperity as indicated by the census returns. He said there might be two countries which reaped greater revenues than Canada, but he thought there was but one certainly the dominion stood third.
