HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS Any even numbered section of Domin-ion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Province, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more

Application for homestead entry or in-spection must be made in person by the applicant at the office of the local Agent applicant at the office of the local Agent or Sub-agent.

An application for entry or inspection made personally at any Sub-agent's office may be wired to the local Agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant up receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and the land will be held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are received by mail.

received by mail.

In case of "personation" the entry will be summarily cancelled and the applicant will forfelt all priority of claim.

An applicant for inspection must be aligible for homestead entry, and only one application for inspection will be received from an individual until that application has been disposed of.

A homesteader whose entry is in good standing and not hable to cancellation, may, subject to approval of bepartment, relinguish it in favour of father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, if eligible, but to no one else, on filing declaration of abandonment.

Where an entry is summarily cancelled. or voluntarily abandoned, subsequent to institution of cancellation proceedings,

the applicant for inspection will be entitled to prior right of entry. Applicants for inspection must state in Nerve sickness—nothing else.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST MINING REGULATIONS. Coal.—Coal lands may be purchased at \$10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracits. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual or company. Royalty at the rate of ten cents per ton of 2,000 pounds shall be collected on the gross output.

Quartz.—A froe miner's certificate is granted upon payment in advance of \$5 per annum for an individual, and from \$50 to \$100 per annum for a company according to capital. according to capital.

A free miner, having discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim 1,500z

1,500 feet.

The fee for recording a claim is \$5.

At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may, upon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 per acre.


