THE LATE T. EATON

TAKEN AWAY WITH SUDDEN COLLAPSE AND DEATH

He Had Been Ill With Influenza—He Began Life in a Humble Way, But in Toronto Established a Great Business.

Toronto, Jan. 31.—Timothy Eaton, president of the Eaton company, limited, died this morning at his residence, 182 Lower Avenue. He had been ill about two weeks with influenza, but at two o'clock, this morning, he was taken with a sudden collapse which terminated fatally.

The late Timothy Eaton was born in Clegher, Ireland, about thirty miles from Belfast, the youngest of a family of nine.

It is recognized to be the equal of any departmental store in the world. The late Mr. Eaton never took any part in public affairs though he was prominent in the work of the Methodist church, while he most-enthusiastically supported the cause of the poor.

Mr. Eaton was proceeding to Ottawa, last night, when a telegram recalled her to Toronto. She was to see and assist the Margaret Eaton school in its performances in the Earl Grey dramatic competitions on Friday night.
